## 1.2 Gaming Instructions:

- There will be 2 rounds in this competition
  - a) Qualifier round
  - b) Final Round
    - Each team will be allotted with a single contest room.
    - Each team is requested to be within the contest room only.

- In the each room one team will be selected as a winner.
- Winner teams will be qualified to the final round.

## ZEPHYR - 2024 BUSINESS ROADIES— THE BUSINESS IDEA COMPETITION

Let's face it, pitching is important. Regardless of your role within the company, the company's stage, or the company's technology, interactions with potential customers, investors, strategic partners (and sometimes even friends and family) will depend heavily on a sound pitch. The art of pitching in a business competition involves presenting the most compelling overview of your company under a set time constraint customized to your audience. You have a limited amount of time to cultivate the interest of your audience and encourage them to take the next step, whether it be a follow-up phone call, tech demo, investment ask, etc. Business plan competitions force you to distill the million things you could say about your company into a well-rehearsed, micro-analyzed few sentences that is easy for your audience to digest and resonate with their interest. Practice makes perfect, and competitions are great practice for becoming your company's pitcher in the big leagues.

## **Process Guidelines and Rules**

#### **General Requirements**

- I. Team
- a. No less than two and no more than four (4) members in a team.
- b. Free Registration.

#### II. Idea Pitch

- a. The proposed idea should be unique and serving to either fill an existing gap/ an innovative idea/ value adding existing product/service/ minimizing cost of existing product/service at some level.
- b. The proposed idea should not be in violation of any intellectual property rights.
- c. The idea should be presented in the form of soft-copy presentation in MS PowerPoint format using the narrative feature to communicate the idea.
- d. The presentation can consist of video/reels working as advertisement for the product/service.

# **Description of Competition & Rounds**

The Competition will be spread across two (2) rounds

**Round One**: Presentation of Idea (Pitch Deck)

- a. Verbal mode of presentation with the help of MS-PowerPoint
- b. Each first round presentation will be reviewed and judged according to:
  - 1. Market opportunity
  - 2. Product/Service viability

- 3. Understanding of competitors
- 4. Business model viability
- 5. Overall attractiveness of the opportunity
- c. Number of Slides: 5
- d. Time Limit for Presentation: 5 Minutes per Team

Teams that do not meet the above mentioned requirements or make incomplete presentations will be automatically disqualified.

Top Five (5) Teams will be selected by the judges to participate in the Final Round

# Final Round: Defending your Idea

- a. Each team that qualifies for the final round is required to defend their business plan by responding to the Questions asked by a Panel of judges. This constitutes the Final Presentation.
- b. During the Q&A session the team in contention is required to project their PowerPoint presentation
- c. Time Limit for Each Team: 5-7 Minutes



# **ZEPHYR - 2024**Mock Press

The "Mock Press" activity is an engaging and entertaining event where participants step into the shoes of famous personalities. They must mimic the tone, behaviour, and personality of the individual they represent, responding to questions posed by "Journalists". This activity challenges participants' creativity, improvisation, and knowledge of their assigned character, making it a highlight of the fest.

## Format:

- Participants will be given any one character on the spot from the six categories specifically designed.
- Two minutes is the time allocated to participants before getting into their roles.
- During the mock interview, they are expected to act according to the character, answering questions posed by the judges

## Rules and Regulations:

- Individual Participation: The event is for individual participants only.
- Subject Choice: Candidates would be asked to choose 1 of 6 categories, out of which a character will be given.
- Preparation Time: The candidate will get two minutes of preparation time.
- Language Flexibility: Presentations can either be in Hindi or English.
- Decorum: All answers would have to be kept respectful and appropriate.
- Prohibited Conduct: Use of foul language and remarks strictly prohibited.
- Role Alignment: Participants must respond exactly as assigned by their respective character

- Students will be judged on Subject Knowledge, Voice Modulation, Realistic Portrayal, Communication Skills
- Final Judgment: The decision arrived at by the judges would be deemed final and notsubject to appeal.

## **General Rules**

# 1. Eligibility:

## 2. Competition Structure

  - A 30-minute multiple-choice quiz covering algorithm basics, logic, and fundamental programming concepts.

# Round 2: Beginner Algorithm Challenges

- Solve 2-3 simple problems focusing on loops, conditionals, and basic data structures.

# 2. Scoring:

Points are awarded for:

- Correctness: Solutions must be accurate.
- Logic: Demonstrating clear problem-solving steps.
- **Efficiency**: Optimized code scores higher.
- Teamwork (for teams): Collaboration and equal contribution are valued.

## 3. Time Limits:

- Each round has a specific time limit, typically:
  - Quiz: 30 minutes
  - Algorithm Challenges: 30 minutes

# 3. Programming and Tools

### 1. Allowed Languages:

 Participants may use beginner-friendly languages like Python, C, or C++.

## 2. Development Environment:

 An online coding platform (e.g., Replit or Hacker Rank) or a provided offline setup will be used.

# 4. Rules During Competition

#### 1. Prohibited Actions:

- No copying or sharing answers with others.
- No use of external help or unauthorized tools(chatgpt, AI tools)

## 2. Permitted Resources:

- Participants may use a standard syntax/reference guide for their programming language.
- Internet access is strictly prohibited during rounds.

## 3. Behavior:

- Maintain a positive attitude and respect the organizers and peers.
- Cheating, misconduct, or disruption will lead to disqualification.

# 5. Judging Criteria

### 1. Correctness (50%):

Solutions must meet the problem requirements.

# 2. Clarity (30%):

o Clean, understandable code with proper comments.

# 3. Efficiency (20%):

 Basic efficiency measures are considered; advanced optimizations are not required.

## 1. Top 3 Winners:

Exciting prizes such as goodie bag, certificates.
